RALLY REPORTS

GET YOUR KICKS ON ROUTE 66: Caravan to Farmington, Sept. 2011

The plan was to travel from Branson to the FMCA Rocky Mountain Ramble, but once we realized the route we would be taking, it became a Historical Route 66 caravan. Crossing Oklahoma and into Texas on I-40 provides many opportunities to visit and view numerous Route 66 sights such as the Blue Whale, Totem Pole Park, Cadillac Ranch, assorted murals, buildings, restaurants and especially gas stations that remind us of days gone by. A tour of the Newell Coach Factory in Miami, OK made us all wish, but we decided we were happy with our current coaches.

Traveling at a leisurely pace gave us the opportunity to visit several museums including the Vintage Motorcycle Museum, Will Rogers Boyhood Home, "Iron Dog", Will Rogers Museum, Oklahoma City Memorial and Museum, Gilcrest Museum, National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum, and the Route 66 Museum in Clinton, OK. One of the more memorable museums was in Hinton, OK where the docent actually closed the museum and took us to the site of some ancient ruts made by the early gold rushers who took a less known southern trail to California. One of the group, Sandy, climbed to the top of Rock Mary with our guide to view signatures left on the rocks by these early adventurers. In Weatherford at the heartland Museum we learned how the wind turbines are erected and how we benefit from this source of power. An added treat was getting to see a wind farm up close and personal-so close we could hear the wind whistling as the blades rotated.

Along the way we discovered many interesting places to eat, some having the "flavor" of Route 66 such as Johnnies in Ft Reno, known for the grilled onion hamburgers. Carol and Ann both thought the chocolate pecan pie was better than the hamburger, and we all enjoyed the breakfast. Lucille's in Clinton is not only a "66" icon, but they serve up great food with an authentic atmosphere. Cattleman's Steakhouse in Oklahoma City and the Big Texan Steakhouse in Amarillo gave us a chance to get our "Midwestern beef" fix, and a chance to ride in a limousine complete with longhorns adorning the hood. Chicken Mary's, or was it Chicken Annie's, in Pittsburg, KS gave us our fill of fried chicken. Palo Duro Canyon provided a chance to get in a short hike and enjoy a picnic.

Once we arrived in New Mexico the cameras were buzzing as we traveled the streets of Tucumcari snapping photos of the many murals just about anywhere we looked. Obviously the town has seen better days, but a project to revive things is going strong due to the murals and the restoration of some of the old Route 66 Motels.

Next stop was Albuquerque and the Balloon Fiesta. Despite all the great weather we had thus far, the weather did not cooperate for the balloons to fly for the first two days. We managed to amuse ourselves visiting Santa Fe, Olde Towne Albuquerque, Sandia Peak and the Balloon Museum. Finally the excitement of seeing hundreds of balloons aloft came on Saturday morning. What a beautiful sight that you can only see in Albuquerque. Just when you think there cannot be much more-the Night Glow proves to be just as spectacular. Sunday morning proved to be even better, with the balloons flying above our coaches and some even landing in the parking area. It was a great ending to an eventful trip across Route 66.

But this was not to be the end of the caravan. We still had a drive to Farmington and the FMCA Rocky Mountain Ramble. The scenery as we made our way north could not have been more breathtaking. Except for having to wait and watch as a Fifth Wheel burned completely to the ground, we had an uneventful but scenic drive. That was certainly a reminder to us all of how vulnerable we are in our coaches.

Attendance at the Ramble was small and there were very few vendors. I'm certain the economy had a lot to do with this, but it was enjoyable and informative. There were the usual seminars which are always educational and the entertainment was, as it should be, entertaining. In keeping with the spirit of October and the rally theme, Spooktacular, there was a costume parade, a pet parade in which Bobbie and her dog Kati won second place and of course Beanbag Baseball. Four SI's: Jim Eling, Ken Olsen, Bobbie Shiplett and Judy Porter served as umpires. This did not leave enough members to form a SI team, so we pitched in and helped form teams for other groups. All in all it was a fun morning with the SI's again proving that we are great sports and willing to help when needed.

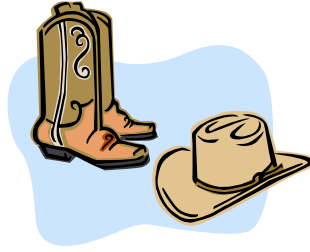
NOTICE OF BUSINESS MEETING/ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Singles International Chapter of FMCA Proposed Changes to the Bylaws

ARTICLE V-ELECTIONS

A. NOMINATING COMMITTEE COMPOSITION: CURRENT WORDING

2. The Nominating Committee shall be nominated by the membership at the Winter/Spring Convention of the Chapter Meeting and shall serve during the year.

A. NOMINATING COMMITTEE COMPOSITION: PROPOSED WORDING

2. The Nominating Committee shall be nominated by the membership at the Chapter's Annual Meeting/Election and shall serve until the next election.

A. NOMINATING COMMITTEE COMPOSITION: CURRENT WORDING

5. The Nominating Committee shall nominate candidates to fill vacancies which occur in elected Chapter Offices.

A. NOMINATING COMMITTEE COMPOSITION: PROPOSED WORDING

5. Remove this item.

ARTICLE V-OFFICER DUTIES

C. SECRETARY: CURRENT WORDING

1. The Chapter Secretary shall keep accurate and up-to-date records of the Chapter's Membership and forward to the National Office a membership list of names and FMCA numbers of the Chapter's members along with a list of incumbent Chapter Officers and certification that the Chapter held the required number of meetings in the Chapter's previous fiscal period. These reports are to be sent to the National Office no later than the last week in December each year.

C. SECRETARY: PROPOSED WORDING

1. The Chapter Secretary shall keep an accurate list of incumbent Chapter Officers and certification that the Chapter held the required number of meetings in the Chapter's previous fiscal period. These reports are to be sent to the National Office no later than the last week in December each year.

D. TREASURER: PROPOSED WORDING

4. The Chapter Treasurer shall keep accurate and up-to-date records of the Chapter's Membership and forward to the National Office a membership list of names and FMCA numbers of the Chapter's Members. A copy of these records are to be³ sent to the National Office no later than the last week in December each year.
5. The Chapter Treasurer, upon receipt of an application and application dues, shall send the new member a Welcome Letter and other materials as appropriate.
