It's a tough job, but somebody has to do it!

An update on the Dozen Does It program-we are at eleven new members this year under the program. We only need one more new FMCA member to designate SI as the reason they joined FMCA. Please encourage anyone you know joining FMCA to turn in their cards to us so we can get credit for them. It would be a shame to be this close without making it. One more and we get a package with prizes to give out during the next year.

We didn't have a quorum at Madison so we were unable to have an SI Business meeting. Our chapter secretary, Trisha Schmidt, has pointed out some additional areas in our bylaws that need to be reworded as a result of FMCA changing their bylaws and us changing our bylaws to be in compliance with FMCA. Also we need to decide when we will have our annual meeting/election next year. FMCA is not having a spring National Convention in 2012 which means if we wait until the next FMCA National Convention in Indianapolis, officers will have served terms of almost one and a half years. If we have an election at Brooksville, FL in February it would mean we held consecutive elections on the east coast and officers would have served less than a year. Another consideration is having the annual meeting/election where there will be a quorum present. Basically that leaves us 2 choices: the SI Dance Rally in Bandera, TX in April or the FMCA National Convention in Indianapolis in August. My personal preference would be the Dance Rally in April which would mean terms of not quite 13 months. ## NATIONAL DIRECTOR'S REPORT

### GOVERNING BOARD MEETING MADISON, WI

AUGUST 10, 2011

1. The FY 2012 budget was approved as amended. It is essentially a balanced budget but with very optimistic member growth assumptions.
2. FMCA headquarters staffing is 46 fulltime and 4 part-time employees.
3. There is no change to the staff benefits program. But it was noted that member ADD costs have risen from 56 cents per member to 82 cents per member so they are looking for ways to reduce these costs.
4. A bunch of P&P changes were discussed and most proposed changes were approved. Biggest discussion was about reimbursement for advance party committee members-whether it should be a stipend per person or a travel allowance per vehicle (the later position prevailed but was limited to one F-number per vehicle).
5. A proposal to eliminate the reimbursement for National Directors was defeated.
6. An Exec Board proposal to establish a committee to establish a separate corporation for self-contained towables was soundly defeated, e.g., there will be no towables allowed in FMCA.
7. Approved deleting 2012 and 2013 conventions in Pomona, CA even though it means FMCA will forfeit \$100K up-front money already committed.
8. Election of National Officers was conducted with results as indicated:
  - President: Czarsty 176, Schrenkel 189, invalid 3
  - Sr. VP: Boyer 148, Rein 219
  - Secretary: Alexander 73, Ferrari 294
  - Treasurer: Couch 141, Young 22
